FY17 Appropriations Status: FY17 appropriations, which started on October 1, are in the form of a continuing resolution (CR) which funds CAP O&M at FY16 spending levels. A vote on the full FY17 appropriations will be delayed until the post-election lame duck Congressional session or sometime next year after the new Congress is installed.

FY17 Legislative Status: See below for the latest status on CAP's funding authorization and actual appropriation.

- <u>Authorization</u>: There is a major difference between the two chambers. This difference is highly unlikely to impact funding for CAP as detailed in the appropriations below.
 - o The House authorized \$30.5 million (M) for O&M.
 - o The Senate backed the President's request of \$25.7M for O&M but also added an amendment directing the Air Force to report on CAP historical funding trends and mission shortfalls that result from funding gaps.
- Appropriations: Both chambers increased CAP's funding over the President's request.

- The House marked \$28.0M for O&M, \$10.3M for aircraft and \$1.7M for vehicles.
- o The Senate marked \$28.5M for O&M, \$10.4M for aircraft and \$1.7M for vehicles.

Next Legislative Day - Thursday, March 2, 2017: Wing commanders can expect early guidance on Legislative Day by mid-December 2016 and should start making appointments as early as possible in January 2017. There will be a detailed briefing on Legislative Day goals and objectives on the evening of March 1 as well as training for first time participants on the same day in the late afternoon.

National Historian

CAP history banner display opened at the National Museum of the U.S. Air Force, and both CAP aircraft have been placed back on display. Created, organized, transported, and arranged two large history displays, first at the 2016 National Conference in Nashville, Tennessee and the second at the Air Force Association's Air, Space, Cyber Conference at the National Harbor, Maryland. Handled and responded to several dozen requests for historical information from CAP NHQ, wings, regions, squadrons, and the general public. Edited and reviewed articles for the special forthcoming 75th anniversary issue of *Volunteer* magazine. Located and obtained artifacts and archival materials for the National Archives and Historical Collections. Continued to provide support for forthcoming display of CAP history banners in the Pentagon and the acquisition of space at Joint Base Anacostia-Bolling which will become the future home of the Colonel Louisa S. Morse Center for Civil Air Patrol History. Arranged the loan of additional World War II senior and cadet insignia for reproduction by Vanguard Industries.

National Archives and Historical Collections Division

Worked closely with the National Historian to develop and display the CAP 75th Anniversary History Display at the 2016 National Conference. Along with the Strategic Advisor to the National Historian, met with staff of George Mason's Roy Rosenzweig Center for History and New Media to

discuss developments of their Omega software that will benefit the functionality of the history.cap.gov website. Located a front-end developer to assist in website design and user accessibility. Arranged for loan of select objects from the Civil Air Patrol National Archives and Historical Collection to be displayed in an upcoming exhibit at the Southern Museum of Flight. Conducted oral history with WWII cadet member and upcoming CGM recipient Elizabeth Daggit Haynes. Responded to multiple information requests received through the history.cap.gov contact form and from CAP NHQ personnel.

Historical Projects Division

At the EAA's Airventure/Oshkosk air show, the Reenactment Liaison officer flew his vintage Fairchild 24 in CAP colors on three different days with public announcement narration, reaching an estimated audience of 150,000 people. In addition, he and his wife located and provided materials for approximately 15 aircraft from across the country to increase the CAP presence at airshows. At Airventure, at least 11 former CAP aircraft and/or aircraft restored as CAP aircraft were present, wearing special propeller sleeves indicating service with CAP. Graphic art support was provided for the propeller sleeves, airshow program ads, and the modernization of a vintage World War II recruiting poster.

Research Division Head

A CAP chronological history has been sent to all region historians for review. Three Chaplain Corps history articles have been edited, together with the CAP Chaplain Corps History. Work is underway to check and update the CAP commander lineages to be completed by early October. A digital template for annual unit histories is being developed and will be ready for use in CY17. Two database projects, one to compile unit charter information, and the other on documenting CAP members killed on active duty are underway and continuously being updated with new information.

Great Job Flying! Final flying hour numbers are still being compiled, but we definitely exceeded our FY16 goal of 106,000 flying hours.

Aircraft Operations and Standardization/Evaluation: There have been many updates posted on the CAP Pilots web page at: www.capmembers.com/emergency services/aircraft ops staneval/

- As of June 15, 2016, the FAA replaced the practical test standards for the private pilot airplane certificate and the instrument-airplane rating with the corresponding Airman Certification Standards (ACS). That means that CAP pilots, instructors, and check pilots should now be using the two ACS documents in now effect for all activities previously based on the PTS. The FAA collaborated with a diverse group of industry experts to develop the ACS, an enhanced version of the PTS that integrates and clearly defines the aeronautical knowledge and risk management elements that support each PTS skill task. It also incorporates today's PTS "special emphasis" items into the appropriate ACS task. The tolerances for maneuvers in the ACS are the same except for slow flight, where the FAA made a change to ensure that applicants do not learn to intentionally disregard the stall warning. For information on how this change affects training and testing, please see FAA SAFO 16010,

<u>Maneuvering During Slow Flight in an Airplane</u>. This change will also be reflected in the forthcoming revision to the FAA's Airplane Flying Handbook.

- CAP Cessna Aircraft & Autopilot Differences Training is now provided to familiarize CAP pilots with the various differences between CAP's Cessna aircraft and between the two predominant autopilot models installed on those airplanes. These optional training tools are provided to aid CAP pilots as they transition between CAP's Cessna aircraft. CAP Cessna Aircraft & Autopilot Training is located on the "CAP Pilots" web page in the "Aircraft Familiarization" section.
- The online version of "FAA Safety Briefing" magazine is provided via web link on the "CAP Pilots" web page. This publication provides relevant and timely general aviation safety related information straight from the FAA's team of professionals. The current issue (July/August) provides tips to pilots in training and their instructors from a panel of highly experienced and distinguished aviators. It also explores the new Airman Certification Standards (ACS) which became effective this summer. The ACS is fundamentally an enhanced version of the Practical Test Standards (PTS) and lists the standards for what an applicant needs to know, consider, and do in order to pass both the knowledge test and the practical test for a certificate or rating.

Communications:

- Constant Watch

16 was conducted 29 April - 1 May 2016. The exercise objective was to demonstrate CAP's ability to provide communications support over a sustained period, move exercise messages from various levels of command solely using CAP's nationwide network of HF and VHF radios, and operate some communications assets without commercial power.

- -- During the exercise, 23 wings flew airborne repeater missions, and four wings, Florida, Georgia, Texas, and Washington, utilized more than 80 personnel to test their communications systems. CW16 highlighted many strengths and a few opportunities for improvement in the future missions.
- -- For more information about your wing's participation, please contact your wing's Director of Communications.
- Annual Physical Inventory for communication items begins 1 October and must be completed by 31 December (CAPR 174-1 para. 2-16).
- -- During the inventory, unit commanders, supply or communications officers shall verify in ORMS the condition, location and requirement for retention of property including tracked communications items. Items issued to individuals must be revalidated during this period as well.
- -- Questions regarding the communications Annual Physical Inventory should be addressed via your chain of command.

CAP Media Coverage: An end-of-the year review of Civil Air Patrol news clips for Fiscal Year 2016 reveals a solid year of national publicity. More than 16,500 online, print and broadcast stories mentioning CAP were generated this year, reaching an audience of over 210 million. News about CAP was remarkably consistent throughout the year, highlighted by coverage of the 2,000th Spaatz cadet in December 2015 and the 2 millionth Young Eagle (also a CAP cadet) in August 2016. A story highlighting the cadet program was also published in FLYING, a longstanding monthly magazine for general aviation pilots with a circulation of nearly 200,000. The ad value of the 16,500-plus clips topped \$13.25 million.

Using QCUA data to look for shortfalls. The recently released Quality Cadet Unit Award (QCUA) data for 2015-2016 provides a great snapshot for recruiting. It offers info on unit success factors such as cadet growth, first year renewals, cadet encampment attendance and orientation flights. http://www.capmembers.com/cadet_programs/library/quality_cadet_unit_award.cfm

If you're at the squadron, you can see in the QCUA data how your unit is stacking up against your peer units and advise your commander how your unit is doing. If you're a group or wing recruiting officer, it gives you a nice 25,000 ft overview of how your subordinate units compare and where you might need to give a unit a boost in recruiting assistance, or maybe help a commander with factors affecting a unit's retention.

FY 17 Recruiting Plans. Units should be deep into building their FY17 recruiting plans by now. Think about your "Magic Number" (http://bit.ly/2cHiV3b) and what kind of membership penetration you have in your echelon's recruiting area (http://bit.ly/1YFfkhU). Use this information to build your upcoming year's recruiting plan then revisit your plan monthly, bi-monthly or quarterly to check your progress. Ten months into a 12 month long plan is not the time to discover you're less than 50% of the way to your yearly goal numbers and have no opportunity to make it up.
