PART 2: Cadet Planning Guide

The Cadet Planning Guide offers a balanced program for 2 years' worth of weekly meetings. This plan is optional and is designed for squadrons that are struggling to breathe new life into their weekly meetings. Moms and Dads who find themselves drafted into leadership roles and uncertain where to turn should find the guide incredibly valuable. However, units are not required to adhere to the training plan.

* Why doesn't the Cadet Resource & Planning Guide cover every bit of material cadets need for each Achievement? First, that would be impossible; there are roughly 100 learning objectives for aerospace and leadership in each achievement, so the time constraints allow for only a small handful of activities per Achievement. Second, the Cadet Program is a self-paced, self-study program. Lessons and activities during weekly meetings help cadets get excited about learning, but in the end, each cadet needs to invest time and energy to master the material and pass achievement tests on their own.

The sequence of lessons and activities covers much of the material cadets are expected to master for Achievements 2 through 8.* The guide assumes that squadrons will hold open houses and indoctrinate new cadets using Cadet Great Start two to four times per year. It is in the Cadet Great Start materials where leaders will find a systematic plan for transforming ordinary youth into cadet airmen in five short weeks.

SCHEDULES

SCHEDULING PHILOSOPHY

This suggested weekly and monthly schedule ensures cadets receive a well-rounded program. Generally considered as "first among equals," aerospace and leadership receive at least two sessions each per month, versus one each for fitness and character. Two unprogrammed, "open" blocks allow the squadron to work on special projects or devote more time to one of the four core program elements.

Because squadrons meet for 2 to 2.5 hours per week, some units may need to slightly adjust the suggested weekly schedule, which runs for 2.25 hours.

Milestone award testing, feedback meetings, staff meetings, and other administrative tasks are not included on the schedule. Most of those items should run concurrent with one of the main training blocks, as needed, so as not to disrupt that week's main activities.

LEADERSHIP CONSIDERATIONS

CADETS AS INSTRUCTORS

As part of their leadership development, cadet officers and NCOs should serve as instructors to the maximum extent possible. At the same time, the senior staff has a duty to ensure that all classes and activities are of high quality. Therefore, the key in using cadets as instructors is proper supervision and mentoring by senior members. Toward that end, the following “check ride” system is recommended:

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| <p>1. Assignment. Senior or experienced cadet officer meets with the cadet/instructor to discuss goals and vision for the class or activity.</p> | <p>2. Preparation. Cadet/instructor begins to do some thinking and finds and personalizes a lesson plan. Cadet should rely on published lesson plans vs. original work.</p> | <p>3. Check Ride. Cadet/instructor presents their ideas in depth to the cadet officer or senior, who provides mentoring and quality control. The class is postponed if the cadet is clearly not ready to take a leadership role.</p> | <p>4. Squadron Meeting. Cadet/instructor leads the activity or class.</p> | <p>5. Feedback. Senior member provides the cadet/instructor with constructive feedback.</p> |
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PLANNING THE WEEKLY SQUADRON MEETING

The key to having worthwhile, effective weekly meetings is planning. Great meetings do not happen by chance. The following planning system is suggested. It’s especially important to note that planning alone is insufficient; the proposed schedule needs to be shared with the entire staff and endorsed by the commander.

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| <p>1. Draft. Cadet officer or senior begins drafting detailed meeting schedule</p> | <p>2. Coordination. 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THE ONE ROOM SCHOOL HOUSE

The toughest managerial challenge for Cadet Programs Officers usually involves the “one room schoolhouse.” In high school, for example, most students enter ninth grade in the fall, work their way through the curriculum in lockstep with their classmates, and graduate on schedule four years later. In contrast, CAP cadets proceed through the Cadet Program at their own pace. At any one time, most squadrons are apt to have a few cadet officers, a large group of NCOs, and a large group of airmen. For all practical purposes it is impossible for a squadron to deliver exactly the right lessons and activities to each cadet at precisely the moment it’s needed. The key is to offer activity content that meets the needs of most cadets; cadets who are higher or lower in rank than the activity’s intended audience can still find the activity meaningful and fun, especially if ranking cadets are used in leadership roles.

ACTIVITY SEQUENCE

PROGRAMMING PHILOSOPHY

Cadets prefer hands-on activities whenever possible. The plan below calls for one classroom lesson in leadership and aerospace per month, with each augmented by at least one hands-on activity per month.

For example, during Month #1, the squadron would conduct LLP-1.4 Ethical Decision Making during one of its two leadership blocks and LAG-9 Mind Games during the other leadership block. Likewise, there are two aerospace lessons listed for the month, and three drill lessons listed as well.
